A 2 Cut a slit. Wind the string.

A 3 x 2

A 1 Thread through the hole.

Keep both strings at a length of about 15 cm each, after threading them through the hole. The string will be easier to thread if you dab a little adhesive on the end of the string and let it harden.

● **Pattern:** 6 sheets ● **Assembly Instructions:** 4 sheets ● **Number of parts:** 41

● **You will need:** Scissors, glue, strong adhesive, a ruler, a used ball-point pen
String (a fairly strong type of thread. The color is up to you, but we recommend gray, brown, or yellow.)

● **Assembly tip:** Trace along the folds with a ruler and a used pen (no ink) to get a sharper, easier fold.

- Mountain fold - - - - - Valley fold ——— Scissors line
- Glue spot ■ Cut out ——— Cut in line
- Hole for threading string through (use an old pen or other object to make the hole.)

Caution: Glue, scissors and other tools may be dangerous to young children so be sure to keep them out of the reach of young children.
